- 6. discussing or deliberating commercial or financial information that the city has received from a business prospect that the city seeks to have locate, stay or expand in or near the city and with which the city is conducting economic development negotiations; or deliberating the offer of a financial or other incentive to a business prospect. [Tex Govt. Code §551.087]
- 7. deliberating security assessments or deployments relating to information resources technology, network security information, or the deployment or specific occasions for implementations of security personnel, critical infrastructure, or security devices. [Tex. Govt. Code §551.089]

SUBJECT UPDATE: CPOB Annual Report

At the February 14, 2023, CPOB meeting, Annual Report Ad Hoc Committee Chairman Alan Marshall lead a discussion about the CPOB Annual Report. He went over the recommendations that the Ad Hoc Committee developed at its meeting regarding the content of the CPOB annual report.

CPOB Chairman Enobakhare, Jr. also discussed the recommended format that the City of Dallas developed for annual Boards and Commissions reports. The template was given to the Board by OCPO Director McClary.

At the end of both discussions CPOB Chairman Enobakhare, Jr. asked the Board for a motion to accept the recommendations of the CPOB Annual Report Ad Hoc Committee and adopt the format recommended by the city. A motion was made and properly seconded. The motion passed by a unanimous vote.

During the discussion, the question of how the multiple-year format would be accomplished came up. The CPOB would like annual reports produced for 2020, 2021, and 2022. Director McClary stated that she was not sure if all three years could be produced as one report. However, she told the Board she would inquire about this and report back to them at their March meeting. Director McClary was able to connect with the City of Dallas Boards and Commissions office and learned that it would be okay for the CPOB to produce a multi-year annual report.

Based on this information, Director McClary shared it with the Annual Report Ad Hoc Committee. That committee will convene a meeting to discuss a reasonable timeline for completion of the multi-year report after the CPOB March 14th meeting and report back to the full CPOB at the April meeting.

There is a page of the Annual report for FY 2023 Proposed Objectives and Accomplishments. CPOB Chairman tabled this discussion until the March meeting to give Board members a chance to think about this. He will share with the Board his thoughts and then open the conversation up for CPOB members impute.
